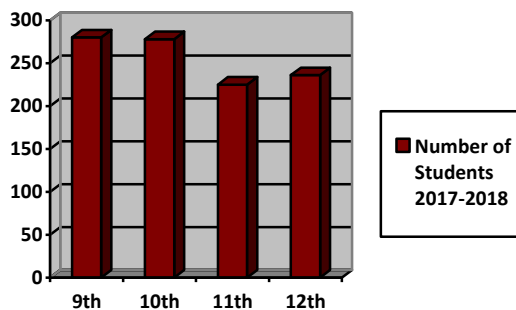

## PISGAH HIGH SCHOOL PROFILE

Pisgah High School was established in 1966 as a result of the consolidation of the Haywood Community School System. It is located in the eastern part of Haywood County, amid the beautiful Smoky Mountains. Pisgah consists of grades 9-12 and has 90 faculty and staff members. The school has been on a 4x4 block schedule since 1995. Our school has four 95-minute blocks that meet five days per week. 1,019 students are enrolled.

### **Graduation Requirements for Class of 2018**

All current seniors must complete the Future Ready Core (FRC) in order to receive a high school diploma. A select few will qualify for the Occupational Course of Study (OCS).

Please contact PHS should you need information on OCS. FRC requirements are:

#### **4 English Credits**

**4 Math Credits** (Math I, Math II, Math III, then Essentials of College Math, Pre-Calculus, Advanced Functions or Discrete Math)

**3 Science Credits** (Earth/Environmental, Biology I and Physical Science or Chemistry)

**4 Social Studies** (World History, American History I & II and Civics/Economics)

#### **1 Health & PE Credit**

**2 Elective Credits** (Any combination from foreign language, fine arts or Career Technical Education-CTE)

#### **4 Credits in one Concentration**

(Academics, CTE, Fine Arts, or ROTC)

#### **6 Credits of Free Electives**

### **TOTAL: 28 Credits** (32 possible credits)

## WEIGHTED GRADES

This policy rewards students for taking more advanced courses by providing up to two additional quality points towards a student's grade point average (GPA).

Historically, a student's GPA has been calculated by multiplying the number of units times 4 quality points for an A, 3 for a B, 2 for a C, 1 for a D or 0 for a F; adding the number of points produced; and dividing the sum by the number of units attempted. Under the plan for weighting grades in Honors, CCP, or Advanced courses, students would receive 5 quality points for an A, 4 for a B, 3 for a C, 2 for a D, and 0 for a F. Hence, a B in a weighted course would be equal to an A in a non-weighted course, and so forth. A 6 point scale is used for Advanced Placement classes.
