FAFSA

Don't forget! You may begin working on your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) January 1, 2016.

Go to www.fafsa.ed.gov for information on completing the application; you may print out a planning worksheet and go online to create an i.d. and pin number in advance! THIS IS THE ON-LY WEBSITE THAT ALLOWS YOU TO COMPLETE THE OFFICIAL FAFSA FOR FREE! *Remember, this is the year to* get your taxes completed early: It will make completing your FAFSA much easier.

North Carolina does not have a "deadline" for completing the FAFSA, but most federal money is distributed by a "first-come, first served" basis. Most schools to which you are applying DO have a "deadline" to receive information generated by your FAFSA: Call the financial aid office or check the school's website. Most schools have a February deadline so that they can notify you of financial aid availability in March. A completed FAFSA is required at most schools to be considered for any need-based aid.

If you think you may need help with your FAFSA, you can participate in "FAFSA Day" Saturday, February 20 at Haywood Community College. Please register in advance at www.CFNC.org/FAFSAday and plan to bring 2015 federal

Please remember to bring in your college acceptance letters for our bulletin board.

We also ask that you bring in any scholarship offers (even if you may not attend that school) so that you may be recognized at Senior Awards Night.

Seniors: Please check those deadlines for any applications you may be mailing in December. Remember, our office will be closed for the holidays, so if you need transcripts or any other assistance, please see us no later than WEDNESDAY, DEC. 16!

January 15 deadline:

- Harry W. Clark Memorial Scholarship: \$2000 renewable for 3 more years; students planning to attend a 4-year NC school
- William A. Hart Award: \$1000 renewable for 1 more year; students planning to attend a 2-year school in NC
- Captain John G. Gardner Vietnam Veterans Memorial Scholarship: \$1000 for relatives of active duty and/or decorated Viet Nam veterans • WNC Regional Scholarships: several scholarships ranging from \$1000 to \$5000 per year for up to 4 years
- February 17 deadline:

• Nathaniel Ellis Cannady, Jr. Scholarship: \$7500 renewable for 3 more years for students planning to study engineering, construction, project management, or information technology.

March 15 deadline:

- Asheville Wilbert Vault Service Scholarship: \$2000 for students interested in a career in funeral service
- John Francis Amherst Cecil Scholarship: \$2000 for up to 8 students who are dependents of Biltmore Employees

• Roger W. Morrison Scholarship: \$500 for students who are children of employees of Pathologist's Medical Laboratory and Mission Hospitals Laboratories.

SCHOOL SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS:

- UNCG in 3 Opportunity: This program has been created to give students the opportunity to graduate in 3 years (and save about \$8000), receive priority registration for courses, and have a UNCG in 3 advisor. Applicants must choose one of the 20 participating majors and should have a minimum of 12 college transfer credit hours (AP, Community College, or Early College--but there are other options including summer prior to fall semester). - Kings College: "Finish First" offers specialized degrees in health care, business, design and technology that can be completed in 8 to 16 months. Available scholarships include four \$5000 scholarships based on scores of the scholarship exam (administered Jan. 23, 2016) and \$1000 scholarships for students actively involved in HOSA, FBLA or DECA. - East Tennessee State University: (1) *Honors Scholars Program* (up to full scholarship for 4 years) for students with 3.5 GPA, ACT score of 29 or higher, who demonstrate service and leadership. Deadline December 15. (2) *Fine and Performing Arts Scholars* (up to full tuition for 4 years) for students with 2.75 GPA, ACT score of 22, and an interest in an art (including music, drama, digital media, etc.) minor. Deadline March 1. (3) *Honors-in-Discipline Scholars* (up to full tuition for 4 years) includes 22 different fields of study for students with 3.2 GPA, 25 or higher ACT. Deadline March 1. - Berea College charges no tuition and admits only academically promising students, primarily from Appalachia (but more than 60 countries are typically represented!), who can document limited economic resources. Berea's cost of educating a student exceeds \$23,000/ year, but all students work at least 10 hours per week in campus and service jobs in more than 130 departments. - UNCG Teacher Education Fellows: \$20,000 scholarship (over 4 years) to elementary/middle school/high school/ special education major with high school GPA of 3.8 or higher with minimum SAT (verbal and math) 1100 or 24 ACT. Students (grades 9-12) were able to meet representatives from Haywood Community College, AB Tech, Southwestern Community College, Western Carolina University, Appalachian State University, East Tennessee State University, Mars Hill University, Montreat College, Warren Wilson College, and Brevard College during lunches November 2-6. Hopefully our students learned something new about programs at two-year and four-year colleges and how public and private schools differ.

On Wednesday, November 4, <u>over 90</u> seniors completed AND submitted <u>over 170</u> applications to colleges. Since many North Carolina private universities were waiving application fees last week only, our students were able to save over <u>\$1000</u> in application fees! An additional bonus was that students applying to HCC had admissions counselors available to answer specific questions.

Any senior who still needs help applying to a college is welcome to see his/her counselor for assistance! We have computers in our office for student use.

- \Rightarrow You have to pay a fee or "taxes."
- \Rightarrow Money-back offers or guarantees.
- \Rightarrow Credit card or bank account information required.
- \Rightarrow Provides "exclusive" information.
- NEVER GIVE OUT SOCIAL SECURITY, CREDIT CARD, OR BANK ACCOUNT NUMBERS TO UNSOLICITED E-MAILS OR CALLS.
- BE CAREFUL TO WHOM YOU GIVE OUT YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION OR EMAIL ADDRESS.
- BEWARE OF SCAMS! (IF YOU HAVE TO PAY MONEY TO GET MONEY, IT'S PROBABLY A SCAM.)
